2- Purpose of the Educational Programme	
Training of specialists in the field of finance, banking, insurance and the stock exchange who possess up-to-date theoretical knowledge and practical skills and the ability for independent learning and self-development, and who are capable of solving applied tasks in ensuring the financial security of business entities and public-sector institutions under the conditions of decentralisation processes in Ukraine and its integration into the European economic area. Competitive advantages of the programme lie in providing students with the professional competences for research and practical work that are in demand in any field of activity (business, public-sector institutions, civil service, non-profit organisations, etc.) where analytical competences must be applied and complex professional decisions made under conditions of uncertainty in the functioning of the financial system.	

Object of study the theoretical, methodological, organisational and practical foundations of the functioning and development of finance, banking, insurance and the stock exchange.

Learning objectives: training of specialists capable of solving complex specialised tasks and applied problems characterised by complexity and a degree of uncertainty of conditions, in professional activity in the field of finance, banking, insurance and the stock exchange and in the course of study.

Theoretical content of the subject area is based on the concepts, categories, theories and approaches that determine the trends and patterns of functioning and development of finance, banking, insurance and the stock market in order to meet the information needs of users of financial information.

Methods, techniques and technologies: general scientific and special methods and procedures for organising finance, banking, insurance and the stock market.

Tools and equipment: modern information systems and technologies, standard and specialised sector-specific software, technologies and methodological tools of finance, banking, insurance and the stock market.

3 – Characteristics of the Educational Programme

Subject area (field of knowledge, speciality, specialisation (if any))	Field of knowledge: 07 Management and Administration. Speciality: 072 Finance, Banking, Insurance and the Stock Exchange. Qualification: Bachelor of Finance, Banking, Insurance and the Stock Exchange. Compulsory components of the programme account for 180 ECTS credits (75%, 5,400 hours); the student's free-choice disciplines account for 60 ECTS credits (25%, 1,800 hours). Compulsory components include components of the general training cycle (46 credits, 19%), the professional training cycle (119 credits, 50%), and the components of practical training and attestation (15 credits, 6%).
Orientation of the educational programme	The programme is oriented towards students acquiring professional knowledge, skills, abilities and other competences, including language competences, for the successful conduct of professional activity. It is based on generally recognised principles and the results of contemporary scientific research in the field of finance, banking, insurance and the stock market, and provides for the acquisition of practical skills and mastery of modern approaches to ensuring the financial security of economic entities. It is oriented towards relevant educational programmes within which further professional career and/or study is possible.
Main focus of the educational programme and specialisation	Emphasis is placed on the integrated formation and development of professional competences in ensuring financial security at various levels of financial systems, as well as the skills required for analysing, modelling and forecasting financial processes and assessing financial risks and threats, in

	order to make effective professional decisions and ensure their implementation in the field of finance, banking, insurance and the stock market. The programme provides for opportunities for employment and further education and career development at the level of Master's programmes of a professional or research orientation.
Distinctive features of the programme	The educational programme is built on the results of advanced research in ensuring the financial security of corporate and public finances; it provides for the in-depth study of the disciplines constituting its subject area; and it is aimed at training specialists capable of comprehensively solving applied tasks of ensuring financial security in the field of finance, banking, insurance and the stock market. A distinctive feature of the programme is that some educational components are taught using a bilingual methodology. The programme also provides the opportunity to gain in-depth knowledge, with an emphasis on developing a theoretical basis and practical skills for diagnosing threats and hazards at various levels of financial systems, based on the use of innovative approaches and the involvement of practising specialists from the field of finance, banking, insurance and the stock market in the educational process. The programme provides opportunities for international exchange and academic mobility within Ukraine and abroad.
4 - Suitability of Graduates for Employment and Further Studies	
Suitability for employment	A Bachelor of Finance, Banking, Insurance and the Stock Exchange ("Financial Security" programme) can perform professional work and hold entry-level positions in public authorities and in organisations and enterprises of various types of activity and forms of ownership, in accordance with the National Qualifications Framework and the National Classifier of Ukraine: Classifier of Occupations DK 003:2010. 5 – Teaching and Assessment	
Teaching and learning	Modern approaches to learning are applied in the teaching process: student-centred learning, self-directed learning, and problem-based learning using blended (active, interactive and distance) forms of instruction combined with extracurricular

	work and work placement. The educational process is built on an individual-creative approach and is based on the research findings of leading scholars. The teaching process includes both traditional and innovative methods and technologies: lectures, practical and laboratory classes, seminars and training sessions based on interactive methods, forms and techniques (virtual business games, brainstorming, the interview method, small-group work, and presentations of students' own research). Qualified practising specialists are regularly involved in conducting classes.
Assessment	A cumulative point-rating system is applied to assess students in all types of classroom and extracurricular educational activities aimed at mastering the curriculum load of the educational programme, through continuous, modular, and final assessments. Students' academic achievements are assessed on: a 4-point national scale (excellent, good, satisfactory, unsatisfactory); a 2-level national scale (pass/fail); a 100-point scale; and the ECTS scale. Summative assessment consists of examinations, credits and graded credits, taking into account accumulated current modular assessment scores; defence of practical training reports; and defence of term papers and qualification/degree papers. Attestation consists of passing a comprehensive examination in the speciality, a foreign language examination, and defence of the qualification work.

8 – Resources for Programme Implementation

Academic staff	The core teaching staff of the educational programme consists of academic and teaching staff from the departments of the Ferenc Rakoczi II Transcarpathian Hungarian Institute. Lecturers teaching within the programme are active and recognised scholars who publish in domestic and international scientific literature and who possess the relevant professional competence and experience in teaching, research and pedagogical activity. Academic and teaching staff undergo professional development training once every five years. The practice-oriented nature of the educational programme provides for the broad involvement of practising specialists whose expertise corresponds to the focus of the programme, as well as the engagement of highly competent experts – including representatives of professional unions and associations and foreign specialists – in teaching, which strengthens the synergy between theoretical and practical training. The guarantor of the programme and the academic and teaching staff who ensure its implementation meet the requirements set out in the Licence Conditions for Conducting Educational Activity of Educational Institutions.
Material and technical support	The available premises meet the standard area requirements. The educational process under the programme is fully provided with lecture halls and laboratories. Classrooms are equipped with multimedia equipment. Specialised computer classrooms with the necessary software and unlimited open access to the Internet are available for practical and laboratory work and for information search and processing of results. Infrastructure for leisure and health improvement is available (2 canteens, a sports ground, a sports hall, a gym, a medical office, etc.).

Information and educational-methodological support	The Institute's official website contains information on educational programmes, educational, scientific and extracurricular activities, structural units, admission regulations, contacts, etc. The information and educational-methodological support of the «Financial Security» educational programme for training specialists in speciality 072 Finance, Banking, Insurance and the Stock Exchange meets licensing requirements, has up-to-date content, is based on modern information and communication technologies, and is posted on the official website of the Institute. Higher education applicants have unlimited access to the Internet, a scientific library, a repository and reading rooms; schedules of the educational process; and educational-methodological support for the educational components.

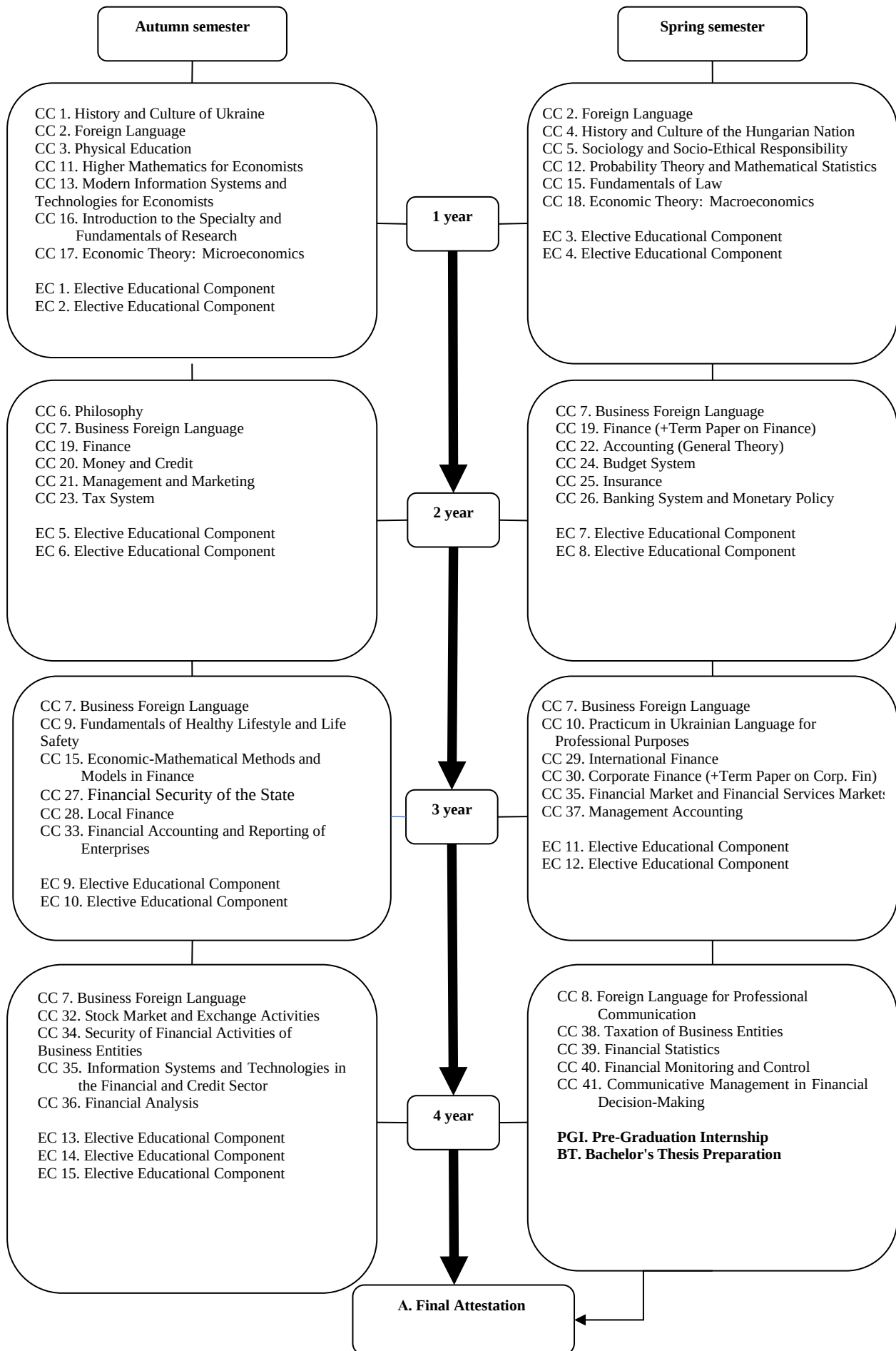

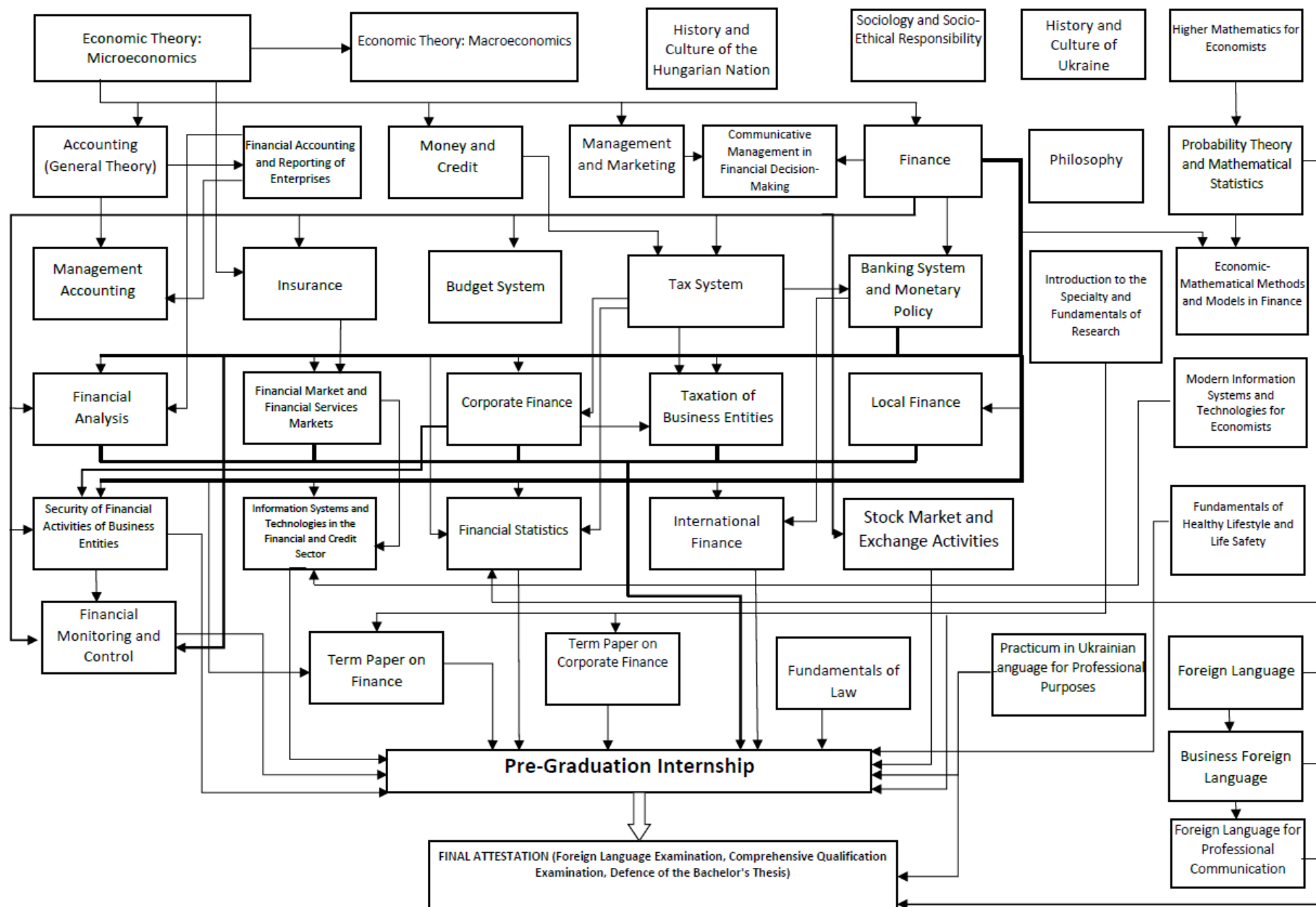

3. FORMS OF FINAL ATTESTATION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENTS

Forms of final attestation	The final attestation of students pursuing the bachelor's qualification in specialty 072 Finance, Banking, Insurance and Stock Exchange under EP “Financial Security” consists of a Comprehensive Qualification Examination in the Field of Study, a Comprehensive Foreign Language Exam, and the defence of the Bachelor's Thesis. The assessment of candidates concludes with the award of a document conferring upon them the degree of Bachelor with the qualification of Bachelor of Finance, Banking, Insurance and Stock Exchange. The assessment is conducted openly and publicly.
Requirements for a comprehensive foreign language exam	The Comprehensive Foreign Language Examination assesses the achievement of the learning outcomes defined by the Higher Education Standard and this Educational Programme and is aimed at evaluating students' ability to use English in academic, business, and professionally oriented contexts, particularly in the fields of finance, banking, and insurance.
